
Focus on Evangelism

As a result of the action of the Supreme Court stirring the nation about abortion, and as the media continues to talk about abortion, the words of the Book of Jeremiah came to mind. Jeremiah wrote: "The word of the Lord came to me: I chose you before I formed you in the womb; I set you apart before you were born. I appointed you a prophet to the nations. But I protested. Then the Lord reached out his hand, touched my mouth, and told me: I have now filled your mouth with my words. See, I have appointed you today over nations and kingdoms." (Jeremiah 1:4,5,9,10)

As abortion discussions saturate media and personal conversation, it dawned on me that perhaps many in our church are not aware of the position of the UMC regarding abortion. I also thought that, as we share our faith in Jesus Christ, we may need some abortion resources to help us be an effective evangelist.

In my reading, I came across this portion out of our Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church. It was entitled "Social Principles: The Nurturing Community," from the 2016 edition of the Book of Discipline. There are three sections I direct your attention to. They are "Abortion," "Ministry to Those Who Have Experienced an Abortion," and "Adoption."

I direct you to these resources, not that they're the only resources, but as one reliable resource on this particular issue that is representative of the United Methodist Church and its point of view. A copy is posted on the bulletin board under Evangelism. See Dr. Carrigan for a copy.

Outreach Update

The Outreach Team is still supporting the church and our community.

We continue to hold the Community Closet the second Saturday of every other month, instead of the first Sunday as it used to be. By having it on the second Saturday we can hand out food boxes from Blessings of Hope. Our next date is Saturday August 13th. We will also be holding a yard sale that date to help clean out the rooms downstairs so we can get ready for the new church year.

We recently counted the pennies in the penny jar and the total was \$151. We purchased four \$25 dollar Giant gift cards in case we get calls to the church for people in need of food.

We have been partnering with the Nurture Team and hosting events for the community. We held an Easter event in April and the children's day in June. We are looking to hold a Friday Night Food Truck and Back to School event on a yet to be determined date. We will continue our support of Fulton Elementary School, and we are planning to resume the Community Table when school starts.

The Outreach Team is looking at having a fundraiser at Isaac's. Keep an eye open for the date.

Blanket Sunday was held in May and we raised \$225. There was a 116% increase in kits & blanket distribution compared to Jan-June 2021. Thank you.

We also continue to support our local ministries. Love Inc. is one of them. Their mission is to empower, connect and support churches as they arise to transform lives and communities, in the name of Christ. There are two programs that our church could support. One is Christmas Adopt a Family. The other is the Homes of Hope program which would help families that are moving into a house with the purchase of sheets, bath towels, or kitchen items. If you are in a small group or a Sunday School class and looking to help the community, keep these programs in mind. And please continue supporting our Grocery Cards program.

Here's to Good Health!

Alzheimer's Disease is not just forgetfulness. Alzheimer's Disease affects people's memories but is much more than simple forgetfulness. It is a progressive, degenerative, and incurable brain disorder that is ultimately fatal. It is not known why some people get this devastating disease.

Alzheimer's Disease usually progresses gradually, lasting from two to twenty years, with an average duration of seven years. Alzheimer's does not affect every person in the same way. Here is a list of stages that represent the general course it follows.



PRE-CLINICAL/PRE-SYMPTOMATIC STAGE

Physical conditions connected to Alzheimer's exist in a person's body long before symptoms are evident. Currently this stage is only defined in research settings.

MILD COGNITIVE IMPAIRMENT

These persons have persistent memory problems like having difficulty remembering names and following conversations, but can perform routine activities without more than usual assistance. This stage can be diagnosed by health professionals.

MILD STAGE

Early in the illness, people tend to exhibit minor memory loss and mood swings and are slow to learn and react. They start to shy away from anything new and prefer the familiar. They can still perform basic tasks but may need assistance with more complicate activities. Speech and understanding become slower, and they will often lose their train of thought. They may get lost while traveling or forget to pay bills. They can be aware of this loss of control and become depressed, fearful, irritable, and restless.

MODERATE STAGE

In this stage, people begin to be disabled by the disease. They can recall the distant past, but recent events become difficult to remember. They lose the ability to comprehend location, time, and day. Caregivers must give clear instructions and repeat them often. As the mind continues to slip away, they may invert words and not recognize familiar faces.

SEVERE STAGE

During this stage, persons become less and less responsive. Memory becomes so poor that no one is recognizable. They lose bowel and bladder control and eventually need constant care. The ability the chew and swallow is lost. These persons become vulnerable to pneumonia, infections, and other illnesses. When the person becomes bedridden, respiratory problems become worse. This stage eventually leads to coma and death.

If you know someone who has Alzheimer's, talk with the doctor who made the diagnosis. They can help you find community support groups, social services, long term and respite care, along with other resources.

Remember that God loves you no matter what the future holds. Keep looking to Him to face each new day's challenges as you deal with Alzheimer's Disease or any other illness.

Please make your checks out to Covenant UMC. After receiving your check, we will mail your grocery store cards to your home.


A/V HELP NEEDED

New Organist/Accompanist Sought

With the upcoming retirement of organist Dolly Kepner and the resignation of Ruby Rublesky as Piano Accompanist, the Staff Parish Relations Committee has decided to search for an Organist/ Accompanist, who will inspire worship through music on Sunday mornings and for special services throughout the year. Formal music education and strong skills in playing the organ as well as the piano are desired along with experience in accompanying choral groups and also vocal and instrumental soloists. The musician should be a committed Christian who is accomplished in playing hymns and has a repertoire of sacred music for preludes and postludes. The Organist/Accompanist will work with the Director of Music to coordinate music appropriate for each service and to rehearse weekly on the piano with the Chancel Choir and/or soloists or ensembles.

Covenant Church has a tradition of excellence in organ music. The church's 1926 Casavant pipe organ is one of a handful of historically significant and tonally unaltered instruments in Central Pennsylvania. It contains over 2500 original and 600 tastefully augmented pipes playable from 5 divisions (one floating) on a 3-manual and pedal draw knob console. The tonal resources in the acoustically friendly sanctuary are ideally suited to not only solo performance but also inspired congregational singing.

This position is part-time with the salary being somewhat negotiable depending upon the credentials of the candidate. 
Piano Accompanist Concludes Year at Covenant
