


## From the Pastor's Desk...

*I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow. (1 Cor. 3:6)*

Recently I read a book entitled, *Dying to Grow: Reclaiming the Heart for Evangelism in the Church* by Nathan Lorick. I want to share this quote with you.



"We were spending our time planning to attract people, when we should have been out ministering to people. We were investing in programs and methods, when we should have been utilizing our resources to meet needs and share the gospel."

A few days ago I was thinking about how to pay off my home mortgage sooner, and the more I reflected on that I felt the solution was to earn more income. But while pondering this I ran across an article that suggested how focusing on money would never lead to earning more money. It then suggested that the solution is to focus on blessing and investing in more people and the rest would take care of itself.

As congregations seeks to survive, sometimes they feel as if its their job to bring in more members, not necessarily to lead them to salvation and discipleship, but for the purposes of sharing the workload and lessening the financial burden. While desiring to preserve the church is admirable, it has a flawed motive and may displace the congregation's focus.

In the book *Start With The Why*, Simon Sinek discusses right motives for success using companies like Apple and Southwest Airlines as examples. Each became successful by focusing on the why more than the how or what when creating their businesses. Apple's why was they wanted to improve information access for all people, and the why for Southwest was centered on affordable transportation for all. The why for followers of Christ must involve leading people to salvation, period.

Nathan Lorick in the book *Dying to Grow* used the above quote to describe how his congregation needed to change direction from seeking strategies and plans to grow the church to simply finding ways to bless more people.

To me this is synonymous with Paul's explanation to the church of Corinth that God has a process, and He and other followers of Christ each contribute to the building of the kingdom. The Apostle Paul uses the analogy of planting seeds in a garden with the expectation of a harvest. As we plant by fasting, praying, and creating new venues to share our life changing faith with others, we do it trusting God will send the increase.

# Leadership Communication

Hello again from your leadership team. Our last report to the congregation was in November. Boy, does time fly, and a lot has happened that we would like to share with you.

we have implemented the following:

Have you noticed the return of the Welcome Desk in the foyer off the parking lot? Our greeters will continue to greet in the foyer area; however, the Welcome Center now has current Covenant brochures and maps. We are also able to promote special programs and activities with flyers at the Welcome Center. When we are able, we have guests/visitors complete a registration card before coming into the sanctuary, allowing us to acknowledge them and follow up when desired.

What is a Flock Watcher? Well, Jesus is our shepherd and we are all his flock, so.....what happens when one of the flock is missing? We search. We have members of the congregation assigned to "watch" for someone who has been missing for more than 2 Sundays. Then our flock watchers let the pastors know so we can reach out to them and bring them back to the fold when possible. If you notice someone who sits near you who has not been attending recently, feel free to reach out to them and/or notify Pastor Sally or Pastor Quentin.

The Leadership Team does NOT meet in a bubble. In addition to our annual Saturday morning retreat in January, we meet with the Chairs of all the church committees quarterly. This helps us to keep the lines of communication open and make sure our Vision and Mission are supported by all.

## 2019 Eastern PA Annual Conference

From June 13 through 15, approximately 700 clergy and lay delegates met at the Expo Center in Oaks, PA, for the 233rd Session of the Eastern Pennsylvania Annual Conference with Bishop Peggy Johnson presiding. The theme for the conference was "Tell To the Coming Generation," based on Psalm 78:4. A worship service opened the conference with holy communion. Other meaningful services during the conference recognized recent clergy retirees, memorialized church clergy and laity who have joined the church eternal, and celebrated the ordination of new deacons and elders. In line with the theme of the conference, a campus minister as well as director of the Florida Conference's Campus to City Wesley Foundation addressed the assembly regarding ministry to young adults.

The business of the conference was conducted throughout the three days, with voting for delegates to the 2020 General Conference and the 2020 Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference. **A summary of the voting results and the resolutions acted upon is included on a separate page as an addition to the Echoes.** Attending on behalf of Covenant Church were Lois Neidermyer as Lay Member to Annual Conference and Pastor Quentin Wallace, who was unable to be at every session due to his daughter's hospital stay.

# Here's To Good Health!

The topic this month is one that people really don't want to talk about, so I'll put it in writing and trust it will help someone who has this problem, or to help ensure you don't have it.

Bad breath or halitosis comes from bacteria feeding on food particles in your mouth.

How can it be prevented? Here are some tips you can try:

Brush your teeth at least twice a day. If you can, brush after each meal. If that can't happen, swish with water or mouth wash. Chewing sugarless gum can also help.

Clean your tongue. Yes, brush your tongue. Odor causing bacteria thrive on the rough surface of your tongue, especially at the back. Gargling with mouthwash also may help.

Drink lots of water or chew sugarless gum. Saliva and water wash away good particles that feed bad breath.



If you have persistent dry mouth, talk with your doctor. Dry mouth can be caused by some medications or certain diseases.

Watch what you eat, drink, or inhale. Tobacco, garlic, onions, and coffee can cause temporary bad breath.

Talk to your dentist if bad breath doesn't respond to these changes. It could be problem with gum disease or an abscessed tooth.

Don't forget to brush your dentures. Brush

them before soaking them at night and before putting them back in.
