From the Pastor's Desk...

"Who Do You Say That I Am?"

But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Matthew 16:15-16



And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. Matthew 16:18

One morning my younger daughter who was about 12 at the time had overslept and wanted to walk to school after the crossing guards had left their post. Because it was later and most of the walkers were already at school, I decided I would drive her to school so she'd be safe. Wanting to be independent, she insisted on walking to school by herself anyway and would not get into the car. So I drove alongside her as I asked her to get into the car. Meanwhile, a lady walking her dog observed what was going on and intervened by asking my daughter if she knew the man who was trying to get her into the car? "Of course," she said, "that's my dad." After that she got into the car, and I dropped her at school. As I returned home, I saw the lady with the dog, and I stopped to thank her for considering my daughter's safety.

It was in the region of Caesarea Philippi when Jesus asked the disciples, those who had been traveling with him for three years, "Who do you say that I am?" Sadly the disciples were not unified with their answers but were quite split as to Jesus' identity. Some thought he was a prophet returned from another era; others felt he was a great teacher with abilities. However, it was Peter, with the help of revelation by the Holy Spirit, who said, "You are the Son of the living God."

At this stage in my life, I realize my understanding of Christ has changed over the years. Initially he was my mother's savior, and she instilled in me and my sister that it was important to go to church, pray, give offerings, and to live right as a Christian should. So, at that juncture, Christ was really my family's God and not mine until I had journeyed longer. As I went through the struggles of life and learned to pray for myself, Christ became my savior. Later in life Christ became my Lord, savior and guide. I was saved but was not entrusting my entire life to Christ. That took a while.

Greetings Church Family,

I'd like to thank you for your steadfastness during this temporary closure of the church. We are planning to reopen the church for worship once the Governor moves Lancaster County to the green phase. Lancaster County will be moving to the yellow phase within a few weeks, and the Covenant Child Care Center is preparing to reopen. At that time, they will be implementing safety precautions to protect staff and children from Covid-19 exposure.

Also, during the yellow phase small groups may begin to meet in the church (fewer than 25 persons) while maintaining social distancing. Until we reach the green phase, we are working on the possibility of holding worship on the parking lot in June. We will announce the dates for those services once the details are worked out. Thank you for your faithfulness, and we look forward to worshiping together in our building soon. In the meantime, continue to worship virtually and uplift one another in your prayers.

When Jesus asked that question of his disciples, I am unsure of what Jesus expected to hear. However, we know Peter's response, and Christ commended him for his declaration but added that his revelation did not come from human understanding and reasoning, but from God. Why did Jesus add that statement? I believe Christ knew that Peter should have been just as unclear as the other disciples but was given for that moment special knowledge through the power of God. In other words, it was too soon for him to make that declaration—Peter had to journey longer until he received an infilling of the Holy Spirt that was yet to come.

Consider what occurred with Peter in Matthew 16, immediately following his profession. He wanted to stop Christ from going to the cross, fell asleep in the Garden of Gethsemane, cut off the ear of a Roman solider during Jesus' arrest, denied Christ three times...etc. Clearly before the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, Peter did know who Christ was or he would have reacted differently displaying an attitude of unfailing trust.

The Covid-19 pandemic has upset our apple cart of security, and it is in times like these when Jesus may be asking us, his people, in the midst of varying opinions, "Who do you say that I am?" While Peter declared Jesus to be the Son of the Living God, Peter's actions did not display the assurance a disciple of the Son God should have. Instead he reacted to situations as if Jesus was just an ordinary man. Brothers and Sisters in Christ, our savior is not an ordinary man but a deliverer and an intercessor on our behalf. Jesus promised us a comforter—the Holy Spirit that provides a peace and security that the world does not understand.

Back to the story I began with...when the lady asked my daughter if she knew who I was. My daughter could say without a doubt that I was her dad, and she was assured that, although she was being stubborn, I had her best interest in mind. If asked, who do you say that Jesus is? How does that provide security for you in a time of certainty or uncertainty? In Matthew 16:18 Jesus said that, based on Peter's profession, the church would be built on the knowledge that Jesus is the son of the Living God, and the gates of hell would not prevail against it.

Although we are unable to gather in person for worship, it does not mean that worship is not continuing. We are praying daily over prayer conference calls, and people are being healed and uplifted as a result. The word of God is still being preached, taught, shared via Facebook Live and Zoom, and people are coming to know God and share their faith with others. A positive twist to this online worship and teaching is our online attendance is growing exponentially, and people are joining us for teaching and worship both locally and across several states. It is at these moments that we truly come to know who Jesus is. Thank you, Covenant family, for making sure Covenant is increasing its influence in the community by sharing your prayers, your gifts, your talents, and your witness.

Here's To Good Health!

We all have been wearing face masks to stay healthy and help prevent the spread of the coronavirus. But what can we do to prevent bad breath?

Bad breath is known as halitosis. Halitosis can come from bacteria feeding on food in your mouth. So what can you do to help prevent bad breath?

Brush your teeth – Brush at least twice a day. Think about brushing after each meal. If you can't brush, swish with water or mouthwash. Chewing sugarless gum can also help get rid of food particles in your mouth.

Brush your tongue - Odor causing bacteria thrives on the rough surface of your tongue. Mucus from postnasal drip can also feed odor causing bacteria. Gargling with mouthwash also may help.

Floss daily – Flossing removes food particles between your teeth.

Drink plenty of water – Saliva and water wash away food particles that feed bad breath. If you have persistent dry mouth talk to your doctor. Dry mouth can be caused by some medications or some diseases.


Think about what you are eating, drinking or inhaling – Tobacco, garlic, onions, alcohol and coffee cause temporary bad breath.

Talk to your dentist or doctor if these suggestions don't help with bad breath. You could be having dental problems such as gum disease or an abscessed tooth. You might need to deal with dry mouth problems; even your stomach or lungs could cause bad breath.

Remember that dentures need attention, too. Brush dentures before soaking them at night and again in the morning before putting them back in.

- And we even had a surprise visit from Quenel last week.



Plans Being Made for Parking Lot Services

The staff and volunteers at Covenant are working hard to be able to allow us to worship "in physical distancing safety" in our cars in the church parking lot. This may allow us to have communion together, see each other, and be " a light at the corner of Mulberry and Orange."

When this happens there will be some rules for you to follow:

- We will transmit via an FM radio signal you can hear in your car
- You must stay in your car
- No one may enter the church to use the restroom
- You may not exit car during our time together
- Pre packaged communion elements will be distributed safely
- Cars will be facing the portico with spaces left between vehicles. Cones or other objects will be placed in spots that must remain unoccupied
- Vans and trucks will be asked to park in the back row to prevent blocking the view of worship participants

This is a "work in progress", please bear with us as we make decisions to keep us all safe; abide by the governor's mandates; and lift our worship to God. We are discussing doing this the first Sunday of each month, until we can worship together in the sanctuary. Watch your e-mails and listen for our calling posts for the date of our first Parking Lot Worship Service.
