*"I am praying not only for these disciples but also for all who will ever believe in me through their message." (John 17:20)*

# Here's To Good Health!

This month I want to share some tips on how to minimize mosquito bites while you are out and about this summer.

First, you need to eliminate their breeding ground. That means getting rid of standing water. I have two watering cans that I check on after we have rain. You also need to change water in birdbaths and fountains at least once a week. If you have outdoor buckets turn them over so they don't collect rain water. Do you have anything else that could collect rain water sitting around? Check those items after rain.

Also think about using yellow bug lights for outdoor lighting. Yellow lights may be less attractive to mosquitoes than ordinary lights.

Most mosquitoes are most active at sunrise, sunset, and early evening. So, if you are heading out to enjoy time on the deck, here are some tips to help you stay hopefully bite free.



Use mosquito repellents that contain DEET. Don't apply repellent under clothing or to rashes, cuts, or sunburns, and always avoid your eyes and mouth.

If you are using sunscreen, apply it before insect repellent. Repellents can lessen the effect of sunscreen. Remember to use a sunscreen with a higher SPF.

Are you going out in the woods? You might want to think about wearing long sleeves and pants. If you are tent camping, remember to keep tents zipped and tears repaired.

Have a great time enjoying God's outdoor creation, and hopefully it will be mosquito bite free!
