This Comes From God, Not Us

We also constantly give thanks to God for this, that when you received the word of God that you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word but as what it

really is, God's word, which is also at work in you believers. (1 Thessalonians 2:13)

Back in the late seventies, most of the young people wanted these great sound systems that included turntables, cassette players, a powerful receiver, and great speakers. The reasoning was that the better the system the clearer the sounds of the records or tapes. A cheap system lacked in quality, while an expensive name-brand went above and beyond.

Similarly, we each want to hear God with clarity even though God has mostly spoken to the people through designated spokespersons. In 2 Kings 22:14-20, Huldah the prophetess, spoke to the king of Judah for God. In Jeremiah 1:4-9, the young prophet was called to speak to the people of Israel for God, and God spoke through Paul the apostle to the people in Thessalonia and throughout the Roman Empire. In the passage above Paul is commending the Thessalonian church for discerning that his words of instruction were not his own but from God.

In today's world, through various media venues, many topics and issues are covered sometimes clearly and sometimes unclearly. We, as the people of God, want to hear clearly what our Lord is saying to us. God's message of grace and love to all creation has never changed even though it's being filtered through many opinions. Therefore, we pray that our actions and deeds, as members of the body of Christ, display the love and grace of our Lord to the world with such clarity that people know what we do is not merely human based but God ordained.

As we transition to fall, there will be many changes. We may not be able to continue ministries as we have in the past due to Covid-19, At this time we need to hear clearly how to continue in this new normal. What can we do for Harvest Home? How do we operate the clothing ministry best? How can we minister at Thanksgiving? And, how do we reach out safely? We pray and listen for God's clear message, and if we are tuned in to the same savior, the communication will be the same.
