


From the Pastor's Desk...

"What do you think? There was a man who had two sons. He went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work today in the vineyard.' 'I will not,' he answered, but later he changed his mind and went. 'Then the father went to the other son and said the same thing. He answered, 'I will, sir,' but he did not go. 'Which of the two did what his father wanted?' 'The first,' they answered. (Matthew 21:28-31)



Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" (Isaiah 6:8)

When I was a teen I enjoyed watching my favorite television programs more than anything, and sometimes it got me into trouble with my parents. On one occasion I was engaged in a TV show when my Mother gave me a directive to either take out the garbage or clean up the kitchen. Whenever I was asked to complete a chore while watching an exciting program I would say, "Sure, I'll get the chore immediately after the program goes off." You guessed it. By the time the program ended, I had forgotten what I promised and went to bed. Although I had forgotten, it did not mean my mother had done so the next morning I would be awakened by a disappointed parent with a scowl on her face. "Why didn't you clean up the kitchen or take out the garbage?" she would ask. I would give my famous line, "Mom, I forgot." And then I would run to do what she had requested of me.

In the Matthew passage above, Jesus provides a parable about two sons and their responses to their father's request. One son when asked to do the chore said he would not do what was requested, but later he changed his mind and complied. The other son agreed to do the chore initially, but didn't fulfill its promise. I believe the point of the story is that it's okay to change your mind and follow the father's request later.

Many of us today have such heavy schedules in our lives that it is difficult to find time to serve in the church, and, as a result, we have a Pareto Principle or the 80/20 Principle. This principle describes how 100 % of the work is done by 20% of the people. If you have been unable to be active in the church for reasons beyond your control but things have now changed, please let me or members of the Nominations Team know.

Over the years we have worn out some of our faithful members by asking them to wear so many hats continually. We simply need a few more people who feel led to say as Isaiah the prophet did in the passage above, "Here am I, send me."

In closing, if you haven't had time to work in the church in the past due to a hectic schedule, it's okay to start now. God knows your heart, and your church family will appreciate anything you can do to assist in the work of the church and the building of God's kingdom.

Hispanic Heritage Month



You cannot speak about the Hispanic culture without dedicating a considerable amount of time on the food. When you think of “Spanish” food, some people think of tacos; others think of rice and beans or beans and rice. When you ask a Latino person about “Spanish” food and where to get a good meal, you have to be specific. They will ask you , Puerto Rican, Cuban, Dominican, Mexican, Peruvian, or Columbian? And the list goes on.

Believe it or not, you can get a taste of all these cuisines right here in Lancaster County. There is a Cuban kiosk at market that sells “Guarapo” (sugarcane juice); a sit down restaurant “Old San Juan” with amazing Puerto Rican food; a splatter of fast food Dominican restaurants with amazing portions for reasonable prices; Columbian delicacies from “Coffee Shop Colombian Bakery” downtown; Peruvian food on W. King St; Flora’s empanadas on Mulberry St; and many Mexican restaurants in Lancaster County.

Won’t you consider tasting Hispanic Heritage this month by joining us after the 10:30 service on Sunday, October 13th? We will have our own sampler of Puerto Rican cuisine.

Here’s To Good Health!

It’s THAT Time of the Year!

Infectious diseases continue to make headlines here in the United States and threaten public health. This year there have been outbreaks of measles. This week a healthy adult doctor from York who had the vaccine came down with measles. Now flu season is approaching, and as always it is difficult to predict the severity of this year’s circulating viruses.

The flu vaccine is the best protection against the flu this season. If you get the flu vaccine, you are 60% less likely to need treatment for the flu by a health care provider. It can also offer other benefits like reducing the need for antibiotics, reducing lost time from work, and reducing hospitalization and even death.

Get your flu vaccine as soon as it is available in our area. Flu season usually peaks in January or February, but it can last as late as May. It is best to get the vaccine earlier in the season.

You need to think about asking your health care provider about the need for any other vaccines. Ask about the following vaccines.

Measles: In 2000, experts declared that measles was eradicated in the US. BUT this year alone there have been more than a thousand cases reported. Measles causes fever, cough, runny nose, and a telltale rash of tiny red bumps. Measles are extremely contagious.

Shingles: Shingles is caused by varicella-zoster virus, the same virus that causes chickenpox. Shingles causes nerve pain that can linger for years. The CDC recommends two doses of Shingrix, for all adults ages 50 and older.

Pneumococcal: Pneumonia is tricky in older adults. It may not cause a fever, shortness of breath or cough, but may lead to confusion or cause pain when trying to take a deep breath. The vaccine can protect against bacteria that cause pneumonia. The CDC recommends two pneumococcal vaccines for adults 65 and older.

Have a healthy flu season! Get your vaccine and remember to wash your hands often to prevent the spread of disease.
